WHAT DO YOU BELIEVE?

Do you believe anything in your life? Yes, we believe everything in life but God! We believe our relationships with others without any if-or-but. We believe every step we put ahead without question, or else life becomes impossible to live for a moment! We believe on every breath which goes out will come back in positively. Then only life is possible.

Do we ever think seriously — "How can we believe things which is uncertain, unseen, unknown, unreasonable, un-understood? Nothing in this world is certain. This we know certainly.

Can I say now that our faith is 'blind'! Yes, this is certain! So why don't we open our eyes? We have the eyes of discrimination. We can reason out what is perishable and what is imperishable. There is certainly something behind all these uncertainties which works as a substratum for all these passing clouds, which is known as the "sky of consciousness" which is not known, not seen, by these physical eyes but known and seen by the discriminative eyes. We should open our eyes and see and believe that alone, not anything else! Our belief should be reasonable and justified.

This is a month sanctified by annual worship of Lord Shiva. Lord Siva is 'Ashutosh', One who is quick to be pleased. He is pleased by penance. He accepts austerity as a rare flower. 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Lord Siva and His Worship by Swami Sivananda

O Lord Siva, Lord of Pasus or Jivas, O Blue-necked Lord, The Destroyer of Daksha's Yajna, The Beloved of Uma, The Five-faced Isvara, Holder of Trident, Swallower of Poison! Prostrations unto Thee. Through Thy Grace I realised oneness with Thee. Sivoham, Sivah Kevaloham. Chidanandarupah Sivoham.

LORD SIVA represents the dissolving aspect of Brahman. That portion of Brahman that is enveloped by Tamo-Guna-Pradhana-Maya is Lord Siva, who is the all-pervading Isvara, and who also dwells in Mount Kailas. He is the Bhandar or storehouse for wisdom. Siva minus Parvati, Kaali or Durga is pure Nirguna Brahman. With Maya (Parvati), He becomes the Saguna Brahman for the purpose of the pious devotion of His devotees. Devotees of Rama must worship Lord Siva also. Rama Himself worshipped Lord Siva at the famous Rameswaram. Lord Siva is the Lord of ascetics and Lord of Yogins, robed in space (Digambara).


Lord Siva, in reality, is the Regenerator and not the Destroyer. Whenever one's physical body becomes unfit for further evolution in this birth either by disease, old age, or other causes, He at once removes this rotten physical sheath and gives a new, healthy, vigorous body for further quick evolution. He wants to take all His children to His lotus feet quickly. He desires to give them His glorious Siva-Pada. It is easier to please Siva than Hari. A little Prem and devotion, a little chanting of His Panchakshari, is quite sufficient to infuse delight in Siva. He gives boons to His devotees quite readily.


Lord Siva is the God of Love. His grace is infinite. He is the Saviour and Guru. He is engaged in freeing the souls from the thraldom of matter. He assumes the form of Guru out of the intense love for mankind. He wishes that all should know Him and attain the blissful Siva-Pada. He watches the activities of the individual souls and helps them in their onward march.

Lord Siva is an embodiment of wisdom. He is the Light of lights. He is Parama Jyoti or Supreme Light. He is self-luminous or Swayam Jyoti. The dance of Siva represents the rhythm and movement of the world-spirit. At His dance, the evil forces and darkness quiver and vanish.

Siva means that which is eternally happy or auspicious, Parama-Mangala. Om and Siva are one. Mandukya Upanishad says: *Santam Sivam Advaitam*. Even an outcaste can meditate on the Name of Lord Siva.

Lord Siva is the Supreme Reality. He is eternal, formless, independent, omnipresent, one without a second, beginningless, causeless, taintless, self-existent, ever free, ever pure. He is not limited by time. He is infinite bliss and infinite intelligence. Lord Siva is the God of Love. His grace is boundless. He is the Saviour and Guru. He is the Beloved of Uma. He is Satyam, Sivam, Subham, Sundaram, Kantam. He is the Supreme Light that shines in your heart. Meditate on His form. Hear His Lilas. Repeat His Mantra *Om Namah Sivaya*. Study Siva Purana. Do His worship daily. Behold Him in all names and forms. He will bless you with His vision.





In this country, the worship of Lord Siva is a symbol of supreme aspiration of man for the attainment of that perfection of which the Lord is the embodiment. Amongst others, renunciation and establishment in Self-Consciousness are the two great features attributed to Lord Siva. Supreme attainment is the fruit of supreme abandonment. Lord Siva is represented as one who is ever Self-Consciousness, which means that God is never different from Himself, never dividing His being into self and non-self. He is fullness, the Goal of all, where all can find their wishes and ambitions completely fulfilled. Lord Siva is Truth itself, (*Sat-Chit-Ananda*) which has to be reached through the means of the negation of untruth, viz., renunciation.

A sincere aspirant on the Path to Salvation, the pre-requisite of which is renunciation, may hold with advantage Lord Siva as one's ideal. That man who does *Tyaga* of the ephemeral objects of the world and sense-pleasures for the sake of knowing the ultimate Truth is indeed a clever man. It is like throwing away a counterfeit for getting a gold coin. He knows that what is thrown away is just nothing, and what is going to be attained is something grand and unique. The secret of Yoga (spiritual practice) is not merely *Tyaga* of *Bhoga* (renunciation of pleasures), but it is the attainment of *Mahabhoga*, the Supreme Bhoga, the everlasting, unchanging, supreme happiness, the greatest of all Bhogas. An aspirant, who is well set on the path of Yoga, knows that if all the pleasures of the three worlds are heaped together on one side and on the other side an infinitesimal speck of that supreme Bliss of the Atman is kept, the latter will by far outweigh the former. This is one definition of Yoga (spiritual practice) from a. particular point of view, and we have other definitions also. There are positive and negative definitions, too. At the outset, questions such as: Should we study Yoga at all? Why should we study and practise Yoga? may arise in our minds. If these questions are to be adequately answered, we have to try to find out what is the origin of Yoga and how it came about; —because all things have an origin. Let us take a simple example. Suppose a child is watching the mother sewing. When you sew, a thimble is put on the finger. "Why are you putting on the thimble," asks the child. The mother explains that it is put on in order that in the event of the needle happening to prick the finger accidentally, it will not cause pain or bleeding. We try to apply that principle to spiritual practice.

And far back, beyond history, there was felt an ancient need by man at the beginning of things. What was that? This is very emphatically seen in the life of Buddha whose philosophy is Nirvana, viz., absolution from all pain and suffering. He found all people suffering and in order to fulfill a need he strove. Similarly the ancients went through human life itself and found that all life is full of defect, full of pain; and this started an agitation in their minds: is there any way of getting over these imperfections and limitations? Is there any way of going beyond these sorrows and tribulations? They found ultimately that the body is subject to six kinds of variations. It has birth, growth and change, disease and decay, and ultimately it dies. When human life is bound by birth and death, in between these two terminals, there is this suspension of life. In this uncertain life of man, then, what little pleasures he can obtain from objects is obstructed by disease, change and decay. Is there any method of getting rid of the imperfection of this earthly life? The ancients were very practical people; and even now the true Hindu is a very practical man. This practical mind at once began to make researches. By persistent efforts, the sages of yore in this country, ultimately plumbed the very depths of human thought and experience and came face to face with Truth beyond all sorrows and limitations, beyond all bond, and finally plunged into an ecstatic experience of supreme Bliss. This knowledge they propagated to others, and from the heights of their experience they gave the call to the mortal world. From an observation and close study of human life, and the vexations, pains and afflictions that beset it, there arose an urge in them to find out a path that will enable them to transcend the miseries of life and death. They felt an extreme urge to discover that unblemished life, and as an answer to this human want came Yoga, the practical method of spiritual practice to take one beyond sorrow, to bestow upon man perennial bliss: Sarva-duhkha-Nivritti and Paramananda Prapti—the removal of all sorrows and the attainment of the supreme delight. So Yoga came as a consequence of a deep felt want of man, when he realised the sorrows of mundane existence and felt the need for a path that will lead one to higher consciousness, where he will experience great peace and an eternal life of perfection. And a preliminary prerequisite for this Yoga practice, a life Sadhana, is renunciation in thought, word and deed, of all that is base, mean and unsublime, the short lived pleasure of material existence.

O Aspirants! On the auspicious occasion of Mahasivaratri, as earnest and real seekers, with a view to attain quick progress in the spiritual path, may you all take to the resolve that as far as possible and to the best of your ability you will strive to stick to the two principles of truth and renunciation. May the All-Merciful Lord Siva bestow on you all the requisite courage and strength in your earnest attempt to tread the higher path and thereby attain the Goal of Life. *Om Namah Sivaya*.
